Sleep Apnea and Dental Sleep Medicine- Diagnosis and Treatment- The Dentist's Role, presented by Dr. Robert Rogers

8:00 am - 12:00 pm

Sleep-disordered breathing (snoring and obstructive sleep apnea) has reached epidemic proportions worldwide. Tens of millions of people cannot breathe adequately during sleep which results in profound medical comorbidity and diminished quality of life. Billions of dollars are spent annually caring for the comorbidities associated with sleep disordered breathing and billions more are lost due to decreased production in the workplace and accidents on the highway. Over the past 20 years dentists have applied their unique skills in an effort to ameliorate this serious malady. Presently, specially trained dentists are in high demand by physicians and patients to join the team charged with creating and maintaining an open airway during sleep.

Participants will be able to:

- Understand the anatomy and physiology of normal sleep and breathing as well as the causes and consequences of sleep disordered breathing
- Appreciate the role of the dentist and how he or she may become properly trained and integrated within the medical community to ensure appropriate scope of licensure and standard of care
- Understand proper diagnosis and treatment protocol as well as the use of different appliance types and possible side effects

Dr. Robert Rogers has been treating patients with sleep disordered breathing since 1990 and presently limits his practice to dental sleep medicine. He is the founding president of the American Academy of Dental Sleep Medicine (AADSM) and served again as president in 1995 and 1999. He is a long-term member of the Board of Directors and has participated in committee work on a consistent basis. Dr. Rogers is a diplomat of the American Board of Dental Sleep Medicine and is the recipient of the AADSM Distinguished Service Award.

Listening, Commerce, and Care, presented by Dr. Bruce Peltier

It is sometimes said that “Dentistry is just another business.” This assertion will be scrutinized. The essential conflicts between the dynamics of a market economy in a capitalist system will be contrasted with the core elements of a healthcare practice. The role of competition will be explored. Fundamental components of effective listening will be reviewed and applied to the familiar task of “treatment plan acceptance.” All of this will be examined through the lens of ethical practice (the study of right vs. wrong and good-bad-better), a timely topic as human services are increasingly delivered through large corporate entities in the United States.

Participants will:

- Review and learn essential components of effective listening in health care.
- Study the core conflicts between the ethics of a commercial market and a healthcare enterprise.
- Understand the important differences between listening and selling.
- Reflect on the implications for daily dental practice and dental education, and corporate delivery of dental care.

Dr. Bruce Peltier is Professor of Psychology and Ethics at the Dugoni School of Dentistry, University of the Pacific in San Francisco. He is a graduate of West Point, and he served as an Airborne Ranger in the United States Army. He earned a Master's degree in education while serving in West Berlin, a Doctorate in Counseling Psychology at Wayne State University in Detroit, did post-graduate research at Stanford University and later, earned an M.B.A. He has taken ethics training at the Kennedy Institute of Ethics at Georgetown University and at Loyola University in Chicago.

Dr. Steve Hollar, Past President of the Indiana State Board of Dentistry, will follow Dr. Peltier with an update on Dental Law in Indiana.
